# Adding COPYRIGHT to digital images

Adding copyright and your name and contact details is important for any image that you wish to post online, otherwise new "orphan images" legislation will allow anybody or company to download and use your image for any purpose they see fit. This document provides notes on how to do this in a number of software platforms.

# In PHOTOSHOP

Select File – File Info (Alt+Cntrl+Shift+I)

On Description screen:

Author should contain your name

Copyright status should be Copyrighted

Copyright notice should contain your name and the phrase "All rights reserved" If you have a website put the address in the Copyright Info URL


On the IPTC Contact screen:


Add all your contact details


On the IPTC Status screen:

Complete the Copyright Notice as on the Description screen. Enter "All rights reserved" in the Rights Usage Terms field.








# In LIGHTROOM

This is particularly easy in Lightroom. Set up a metadata preset which contains your contact and copyright details in the IPTC Copyright and IPTC Creator sections. See below for an example.



Then in the Import dialog ensure that your preset is always applied to all of your images (under Information to apply – Metadata – just select your named preset). You only need ever set this up once, and all your images will have the copyright metadata embedded! (Just one of the myriad time saving benefits of Lightroom).
